In accordance with RL memorandum 05-AMCP-0428, you are delegated the duties and responsibilities of Remedial Project Manager (RPM) for all remedial actions that occur within the UPR-200-E-83, located within the 200-UR-1 Operable Unit.

This delegation is made pursuant to the requirements of 40 CFR 300.120 which directs that the lead agency (DOE) shall assign an RPM to manage remedial actions at National Priority List (NPL) sites. The DOE RPM will direct response efforts and coordinate all other efforts at the scene of CERCLA discharges or releases for the UPR-200-E-83, located within the 200-UR-1 Operable Unit on the Hanford Site's Central Plateau. Although you have been delegated RPM responsibilities, necessary technical direction to RL contractors will be through a designated Contract Officer Representative (COR), and any scope changes outside the existing contract will be approved by the Contracting Officer (CO). Your primary responsibilities are as follows:

1. The RL RPM will coordinate and review the work of other agencies, responsible parties, and contractors to assure compliance with the National Contingency Plan (NCP), Records of Decision (ROD), Hanford Federal Facility Agreement and Consent Order (Tri-Party Agreement), Sampling and Analysis Plans (and referenced documents), Remedial Action Work Plans (and referenced documents), administrative order, and lead agency (RL)-approved plans applicable to the response. The RPM will recommend action to the COR or CO for decisions by lead agency officials.
2. The RL RPM will evaluate and coordinate all decision-making processes necessary to ensure compliance with the NCP, including agreements between the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) or other federal agencies and the state.
3. The RL RPM will coordinate activities with EPA and the State of Washington Department of Ecology, as specified under 40 CFR 300.120 and Hanford Federal Facility Agreement and Consent Order (Tri-Party Agreement).
