




V. Near Term Schedules and Ongoing Activities (Milestones, TSD Unit)

A. LLBG Permit Status

Jennifer Ollero (Ecology) expressed concern that the certified Part B permit application RL/CHPRC will be sending Ecology won't contain some changes that are necessary to facilitate separation of the burial grounds into two or more units. One unit would be for burial grounds currently being operated and another could be for the burial grounds undergoing closure. Ms. Ollero stated that she will continue to focus on the operating units. The portion undergoing closure will require a compliance schedule since closure will be completed under an alternative authority.

Tony Miskho (CHPRC) raised two topics that are being discussed with RL. The first topic was regarding an approach to document and implement how to use alternative requirements at different TSD units. The second topic was the challenge in addressing the groundwater monitoring network associated with the waste management area if the unit is split up. One issue would be new wells that are drilled. Ms. Ollero responded that the groundwater piece presents a problem whether the burial grounds are split up or whether they are left as one unit.

B. Groundwater Sampling

Stuart Luttrell (CHPRC) reported that sample results for total organic carbon in one of the groundwater monitoring wells for Waste Management Area 4 (WMA-4) exceeded critical mean values. RL provided notification to Ecology on January 15, 2009. CHPRC is developing two assessment plans that will be transmitted to RL next week, and RL will transmit them to Ecology by January 30, 2009. CHPRC is reviewing results from a special sampling event conducted in December 2008. This review will not hold up the assessment plans which are scheduled to be implemented in March 2009.

Mr. Luttrell explained that implementation of the assessment plan is completed in two phases. When the assessment activity begins, both the affected well(s) and adjacent wells will be sampled and analyzed for a broad list of parameters including Appendix IX organic constituents as well as non-dangerous constituents. If any dangerous constituents are identified in the groundwater, a determination is made as to whether they originated from the monitored facility. If it is determined that the facility is the likely source, the next phase of

the assessment is initiated.

If there are no dangerous constituents in the groundwater, then indicator evaluation monitoring will resume. A report will be written following the implementation of the first determination, and it will provide the path forward. If there is a determination of dangerous constituents from the facility, the assessment plan will be revised to include the details to evaluate the rate and extent of contaminant migration.

All the wells in WMA-1 were sampled in December 2008, except for one that was sampled in January 2009 due to weather. The wells in WMA-4 are being sampled this month (January). WMA-3 will be sampled in March 2009, and WMA-2 will be sampled in April 2009.
