

III. Project Specific Issues

A. ETF/LERF Dangerous Waste Permit Status

Rick Bond (Ecology) stated that Kathy Conaway (Ecology) is completing her work on the LERF permit, and a final draft of the permit, with attached addendums, will be placed on Share Point for RL/CHPRC to review. Mr. Miskho noted that review of the waste analysis plan (WAP) addendum will require the main effort since it's been a lengthy period of time since the workshops on the WAP were held. Mr. Bond noted that language for the permit condition requiring an extra well has already been agreed to and just needs to be inserted into the permit. Doug Hildebrand (RL) stated that the geophysics work to assist in locating the new well should be implemented next week.

B. 310/340 Status

Sen Moy (RL) stated that Washington Closure Hanford (WCH) has modified portions of the 310 TEDF by converting three of its tanks. The pipelines have been rerouted to the waste collection sump tank where samples are taken, and then the waste is routed into one of the two other 310 TEDF tanks. If the analytical samples meet the city of Richland permit requirements, the waste is routed into the city's sewer system. If it doesn't meet the requirements, the capability is in place to route the liquid to ETF. By the end of this fiscal year (9/30/10), WCH will take over everything in 310 TEDF except for the modified system, which CHPRC will operate. The River Corridor contractor will demolish the buildings in the area, leaving the three tanks.

There was no change in status reported on the ST4502 permit.

There was no change in status reported on the ST4500 permit.
