

A. ETF/LERF Dangerous Waste Permit Status

Tony Miskho (CHPRC) affirmed that all files needed for a final check have been received from Ecology. RL/CHPRC is reviewing them. The groundwater monitoring conditions will be discussed in a meeting later today. Another meeting for the other addendum comments is planned for next week. There are disconnects between the draft revision 9 permit conditions and a Class 3 permit modification letter regarding groundwater monitoring currently being prepared for transmittal. The parties discussed the issue of how delays in issuing revision 9 to the permit make it necessary for RL/CHPRC to request an update to revision 8C to make it accurate.

VII. General Discussion
