

September 15, 2011

- I. Approval of August 25, 2011 LERF/200 Area ETF and WESF Project Manager Meeting Minutes and Ecology Signature of June 23, 2011 Meeting Minutes (Ecology/DOE-RL/CHPRC).
- A. The August PMM minutes were approved by the Tri-Parties, and Ecology's signature was obtained for the June PMM minutes.
- II. Operational Status
- A. Harlan Boynton (CHPRC) provided the operational status for LERF/200 Area ETF. Mr. Boynton noted that preparations are being made for a basin 44 campaign. Basin 44 is used for the collection of effluents that have a higher radiological dose.

200 Area Treated Effluent Disposal Facility (TEDF) – receiving wastewater at ~34 gpm during August (based on TEDF Flow Summary Datasheet)

III. Status of Previous Agreements and Commitments

- A. Doug Hildebrand (RL) reported that the well to the north side of LERF is in the process of being drilled and was down to 120 feet yesterday (9/14/11). It is anticipated that the top of the basalt will be hit between 190 and 200 feet, and approximately 20-30 feet will be drilled beyond that.

IV. New Agreements and Commitments

- A. There were no new agreements or commitments.

V. Near Term Schedules and Ongoing Activities (Milestones, TSD Unit)

- A. LERF/200 Area ETF Dangerous Waste Permit Status
Rick Bond (Ecology) stated that there was no change in status to the LERF/200 Area ETF permit from last month, and the permit is ready to go out for public comment.
- B. WESF Dangerous Waste Permit Status
Mr. Bond stated that the WESF permit is ready to go out for public comment, with the exception of resolution of the Land Disposal Restriction (LDR) issue. Mike Collins (RL) stated that he will be drafting a table with TPA dates. Mr. Collins also noted that RL has taken a position that generally a TPA requirement and a permit requirement should not state the same thing, and RL legal is reviewing that issue. Mr. Bond agreed, stating that the AGs have indicated that the TPA should not be cited in the permit, and that the permit should point to the LDR report, which would then point to the TPA. Mr. Bond stated that he has requested the AG to confer with RL legal to resolve the language in the permit. Mr. Collins stated that the language will be revised in the permit to point to the LDR report. Mr. Bond noted that the LDR report will have milestones that require RL to develop a schedule in 2016 and 2018. Tony Miskho (CHPRC) asked if the LDR issue need to be tracked in this PMM. Mr. Collins stated that the LDR issue is a global issue, and it is being tracked by the permit committee.
- C. ST4502 Permit Status
Stacy Nichols (Ecology) stated that the intent is to submit a final ST4502 permit to RL for review by next week. The public comment period is slated for mid-October 2011, and Ecology anticipates the permit will be issued and effective by the beginning of 2012.
- D. ST4500 Permit Status
Ms. Nichols stated that there was no change in status on the ST4500 permit, and that Ecology has not started working on the permit. Mr. Bond initiated a discussion regarding the ST4511 permit, which is under MSA's purview. ST4511 covers all the miscellaneous stream discharges; i.e., from a water cooler, ice maker, chiller, compressor, etc. Mr. Bond stated that Ecology is seeking a rough estimate of the number of components in the 300 Area. Ms. Nichols noted that

the information will be located in the fact sheet and not in the permit. Mr. Collins stated that MSA should already have a list of components, and that he would talk to the MSA point of contact to learn what information is available.

VI. Approved Changes Signed Off in Accordance with TPA Section 12.2

A. There were no approved changes identified.

VII. General Discussion

A. Brian Dixon (CHPRC) noted that Mr. Boynton and Kathy Clouse (CHPRC) are leaving the Hanford Site. Mr. Dixon expressed appreciation for the excellent work Mr. Boynton has performed, and recognized Ms. Clouse for her administrative support with the PMMs.
