1100 AREA PROPOSED PLAN FACT SHEET, Superfund Public Comment Period and Public Meeting Notice

BACKGROUND: The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology), and the U.S. Department of Energy (USDOE) have completed the study and evaluation phases of activities for the 1100 Area Superfund Site. At this time, the *1100 Area Proposed Plan* outlining proposed cleanup activities for the four 1100 Area Operable Units, is available for public comment. The Operable Units are designated as 1100-EM-1, 1100-EM-2, 1100-EM-3, and 1100-IU-1. The locations are shown on the enclosed figure.

EVENTS: Upcoming events include a formal public comment period on the proposed cleanup activities and a formal public meeting.

All comments will be reviewed and considered before a final decision is made on cleanup activities.

OVERVIEW OF CLEANUP ACTIONS: Three of these areas to be cleaned up are located northwest of the city of Richland. The other is located on Rattlesnake Mountain. The proposed cleanup activities within this plan consist of excavation and offsite treatment and disposal of contaminated soils and debris from 52 waste management units within the four Operable Units. In addition, the Horn Rapids Landfill would be capped and area groundwater monitored to ensure no impacts to drinking water supplies occur. The 1100 Area studies found contaminants in the groundwater. However, the areas of

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contamination are distant from drinking water supply wells and the groundwater is flowing away from the wells.
