Dear Mr. Schepens:

The Department of Ecology grants your verbal request to store less than 500 milliliters of liquid waste (identified as containing organics) received from the T Plant facility in the hot cells for a period of three weeks. The containers must be stored in secondary containment in the hot cells.

During the three week storage period, laboratory personnel must determine a path forward for the waste that does not include disposal into the 219-S tank system. This planned path forward must be provided to Ecology by Monday, October 23, 2006.
