Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) appreciates the opportunity to provide comments on the document titled *Phase I Feasibility Study for the Canyon Disposition Initiative (221-U Facility)*, DOE/RL-97-11, Rev.0.

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
WDFW concurs with the recommendation to proceed with the next phase of analysis for alternatives 1, 3, 4, and 6. We also agree that alternative 5 should not be considered any further since it would entomb mostly clean geological resources and would not make efficient use of these resources.

Future analysis for alternative 1 should consider the endpoint of using the trench created during the decommissioning of the facility for future waste management activities, e.g. a low level burial ground, instead of a greenfield condition.

We would like to be kept informed of the 221-U Facility disposition as the CERCLA process progresses.

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
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
