






PURGEWATER PROJECT MEETING MINUTES

Project Managers Meeting

April 24, 2008

- I. Approval of February 28, 2008 Purgewater Project Meeting Minutes (Ecology/DOE-RL/FH). The PMM minutes were approved. The March 2008 PMM was cancelled.
- II. Operational Status
 - A. John Winterhalder (FH) reported that 93,655 gallons of purgewater was delivered to ETF from the modutank. It was noted that the Liquid Processing and Container Storage PMM reported 95,000 gallons to ETF. Linda Petersen (FH) explained that she reports an approximate number because the tanker numbers often shift slightly.
- III. Project Specific Issues
 - A. Strategy Document Status
 1. Kathy Conaway (Ecology) stated that Ecology and EPA review have determined that the strategy document is not a legal document and recommendations to the Sitewide coordinator, Greta Davis, was not to include the purgewater strategy plan as part of the sitewide permit when reissued. Mr. Winterhalder stated that the plan is on hold to reline Modutank No. 2, take it out of the permit and then operate it under CERCLA as a CERCLA unit until the new treatment plant in 200 West is built. It has been determined Modutank No. 2 would be operating as a nonregulated unit under that scenario, which puts the facility at risk on a daily basis. Mr. Winterhalder stated that the current plan is to do an engineering study for the remainder of this fiscal year, and to identify options for managing the purgewater while continuing to use Modutank No. 1.

Mr. Winterhalder also referred to a 1992 fact sheet from EPA regarding management options for IDW waste, including purgewater. Greta Davis (Ecology) expressed interest in reviewing the document. It was agreed that a meeting needed to be scheduled to get direction regarding the use of the modutanks.
 - B. Purgewater Sediment Issues
 1. Mr. Winterhalder stated that a new filter skid unit was purchased to use in removing liquid from the modutank into the purgewater trucks, and there is currently about 13 - 14 inches of freeboard in the modutank.
- IV. General Discussions
 - A. There were no topics for general discussion.

- V. Status of Actions
 - A. 977 - Formally transmit the Modutanks closure plan package to RL. There was no change in status.
 - B. 1894 - Set up a meeting to discuss issues relevant to signing the purgewater strategy document. Mr. Winterhalder will schedule a meeting with RL, FH, Ecology and EPA.

- VI. New Actions Items
 - A. There were no new actions.

- VII. Documents for submittal to the Administrative Record
 - A. There were no documents identified.

- VIII. Next Project Managers Meeting
 - A. The next PMM was scheduled for May 22, 2008.
