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This form documents agreement among the parties listed below authorizing classification of the subject unit as rejected, closed-out, or no action and authorizing backfill of the site, if appropriate. Final removal from the NPL of no action or closed-out sites will occur at a future date.

**Description of current waste site condition:**

The site consists of 2 septic tanks and inert rubble resulting from demolition of a concrete block house. The septage was removed from both tanks sometime in the past. In July, 2000 the lids were removed from both tanks and the void space in both tanks was filled with a sand slurry. The inert rubble was discarded in a landfill.

**Basis for reclassification:**

The system has been abandoned in accordance with WAC 246-272-18501. The inert rubble was removed and both septic tanks have been permanently removed from service, all septage removed and the tanks filled with sand. In addition, signs have been posted at the site to indicate abandonment, and a letter was sent to notify the Washington State Department of Health of the abandonment (00-OSS-498).

Per TPA-MP-14 (Table 2-3) only DOE-RL approvals are required for septic systems abandoned per WAC 246-272-18501.
