


<b>Summary Discussion:</b>  <p><i>Removal Action Work Plan for 300 Area Facilities, (DOE/RL-2004-77, Rev. 2) documents activities to be performed to achieve the non-time-critical removal action for surplus facilities located in the 300 Area on the Hanford Site. The removal process is achieved through the deactivation, decontamination, decommissioning, and demolition (D4) of surplus facilities. River Corridor Project D4 progress to date has resulted in the elimination of ancillary facilities in the 300 Area that were used house support service functions (e.g., maintenance shops) that directly support both removal and remedial actions in various Hanford Site operable unit locations. Therefore, a clear and present need has resulted in the establishment of noncontiguous facilities to provide infrastructure support that are necessary for implementation of the 300 Area CERCLA response action. These noncontiguous facilities have the potential to conduct regulated activities.</i></p>		
<b>Justification and Impact of Change:</b>  <p>CERCLA contains provisions that allow for two or more noncontiguous facilities that are reasonably related on the basis of geography or on the basis of the threat or potential threat to the public health or welfare or the environment, to be treated as one for the purposes of a response section.</p> <p>RAWP, Section 4.2.3.1 existing discussion of ERDF container queue location:</p> <p>"For the 300 Area facilities addressed under this action, the onsite area is defined as the main industrial portion of the 300 Area (see Figure 1-2), and includes the ERDF container queue located directly north of the 300 Area boundary fence, which is shared between 300-FF-2 remedial actions and the removal actions performed under this work plan. Within the onsite area only the substantive requirements of the ARARs apply."</p> <p>Change to:</p> <p>"For the 300 Area facilities addressed under this action, the onsite area is defined as the main industrial portion of the 300 Area (see Figure 1-2), and includes the ERDF container queue currently located in a posted and fenced lot east of the 318 Building and immediately south of Cypress Street. It is noted that changing conditions may necessitate further movement of the queue at a future date. The onsite area also encompasses contractor leased facilities at Energy Northwest that house craft support activities necessary for implementation of this response action. Within the onsite area only the substantive requirements of the ARARs apply."</p>
