All items on the agenda were addressed. Additional items included discussion of project funding constraints.



AGENDA ITEM 1 - Public Involvement

Draft schedules for upcoming public involvement activities, based on June 13, 1994, publication of the regulatory package, were distributed. Discussion of the schedules identified that public meeting dates may need to be coordinated with the Hanford Advisory Board meetings. A wording change was suggested: the comment response document issued with the record of decision should be called a responsiveness summary. Agreement: The draft schedule distributed in this meeting will be used as a baseline; public involvement activities will work to this schedule.

The siting issue was discussed as a possible public meeting topic. While 6.12 square miles were originally designated for use, the current design requires 1.6 square miles. Public comment has identified the amount of land required for disposal as an issue; it should be minimized. This change could necessitate revision of the site evaluation report and the Corrective Action Management Unit (CAMU) application. The recommendation was made, regardless of land requirements, to stay within the Waste Management Area (WMA), as defined by the Hanford Future Site Uses Working Group. Siting within the WMA could become a public meeting topic. Explaining the reasons for staying within the WMA would be necessary. The need to stay on the 200 Area Plateau should be clearly stated.

During discussion of siting, it was mentioned that the Hanford Advisory Board would like a presentation on ERDF. This could occur at the June 10 meeting. This presentation should emphasize the large trench and minimization of land requirements.

Discussion of the responsiveness summary followed. The State of Washington Department of Ecology suggested that the reduced land requirement be included in the responsiveness summary. The document should be readable for someone who has not attended the scoping meetings.

AGENDA ITEM 2 - Correction Action Management Unit Revision Process

Discussion of the CAMU revision process covered definition of the process. Unless a modification is made to the Environmental Restoration Disposal Facility design, it will not be necessary to modify the CAMU application. Additional information will be incorporated into the document; no public hearings will be required.

AGENDA ITEM 3 - Open Action Items

A list of action items was read. Those actions which had been closed were noted. A list of open action items will be presented at the next meeting.

AGENDA ITEM 4 - Additional Topics

An errata sheet was prepared for the conceptual design report. This will initiate operations in 1996 with 2, lined cells. The project will be completed with 4, lined cells and 10, rough-graded cells. A comment was made

that no document exists which schedules waste volume delivery. There is a document which projects waste by site, but not type and delivery date.
