Public Notice and Opportunity to Comment  
Hanford Site's 200-BP-1 Operable Unit Work Plan  
This Public Notice announces a 30-day public comment period to run from September 5 to October 4 on the Draft Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study Work Plan for the 200-BP-1 Operable Unit at the Hanford Site, Richland Washington. The work plan describes how the area will be investigated as an early step in the cleanup of the area as prescribed by the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA).  
The 200-BP-1 Operable Unit covers approximately 25 acres in Hanford's 200 East Area where chemical processing and waste management activities are conducted. It contains nine inactive cribs (underground drain fields) in which low-level radioactive liquids and mixed (chemical and radioactive) liquids were disposed from the 1950s through the early 1970s. Three unplanned releases also occurred in the 200-BP-1 Operable Unit.  
The purpose of the public process is to allow interested citizens the opportunity to evaluate and comment on the draft work plan prior to final approval by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). Copies of the plan are available at the following locations:
