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


This form documents agreement among the parties listed below authorizing classification of the subject unit as rejected, closed-out, or no action and authorizing backfill of the site, if appropriate. Final removal from the NPL of no action or closed-out sites will occur at a future date.

**Description of current waste site condition:**

The site was a Radiological Materials area (RMA) with four metal boxes containing filters, resting on shoring that sat on the bare soil. An additional six filter frames, marked as having fixed contamination, rested directly on the soil. The waste in question apparently came from N Area in the 1980s before approval of the original Hanford 100 Area ROD. The waste was originally stored in 190C or 183C before being sent to the current RMA in the 100 BC Area. Placement in the RMA occurred prior to the Remaining Sites ROD. Therefore, the waste was clearly not moved into the location post-ROD in order to take advantage of the ROD allowance. Given this situation, the waste is legitimately viewed as legacy waste residing within an RMA eligible for inclusion in the Remaining Sites ROD. The EPA (Dennis Faulk) requested that the RMA be entered into WIDS to document its existence and location.

**Basis for reclassification:**

All contaminated filter frames have been disposed of at ERDF. Because the filter frames were solid waste, no releases to the soil are expected. A radiation survey was completed at the site after the frames were removed to document that the RMA could be downposted; the survey results met the requirement for downposting an RMA. This reclassification form documents agreement with DOE and the regulatory agency that the action fulfills TPA Milestone M-16-26G.
