I. Approval of April 26, 2007 T Plant Complex Project Meeting Minutes (Ecology/DOE-RL/FH).
The PMM minutes were approved.

II. Operational Status

- Mixed Waste Received (includes inter-facility transfers)
0.00 M3 0 55-gallon drum equivalents
- Mixed Waste Transferred Onsite
0.00 M3 0 55-gallon drum equivalents
- Mixed Waste Shipped Offsite
0.83 M3 4 55-gallon drum equivalents

- TRU Mixed Waste Repackaging
 - No TRU waste repackaged in April 2007 due to criticality safety issue.
- TSCA Risk Based Disposal Approval (RBDA) for Albany PCB Drums
 - Under development by FH Environmental Protection
 - Preliminary discussions with Dave Bartus of EPA Region X have been positive.
- Washington Dept. of Health Audit of T Plant Consolidated NOC
 - On Monday, March 26, 2007, WDOH audit began. Responses and documentation to WDOH's six questions were provided. Five questions were answered and one question required further details on how T Plant determines the first of the year dose equivalent curies (DE-Ci) inventory.
 - On Thursday, May 3, 2007, RL submitted information to Mr. Adams on the DE-Ci inventory. T Plant added 21.8 DE-Curies for fixed inventory in the canyon cells and <1.7E-04 DE-Curies for fixed inventory on the floor, walls and ceiling. Response from Mr. Adams is pending.
- Washington Dept. of Health EPA Level II NESHAPS Inspection
 - On January 30, 2007, WDOH conducted a physical inspection of the 291-T Stack sampling and monitoring equipment and reviewed various air compliance documents. No issues or concerns were identified.

- On May 3, 2007, Washington Dept. of Health conducted part two of the EPA Level II NESHAPS inspection that began on January 30, 2007. WDOH conducted a physical inspection of the 291-T stack HEPA filters and reviewed various air compliance documents. No issues or concerns were identified.

Paul Martin (FH) stated that a decision had been made yesterday to not pursue the RBDA for the Albany PCB drums. The plan was to decant the water off the drums and send the water to ETF or Perma-Fix. However, ETF had a narrow window to receive the PCB amounts, and since the water would likely go to Perma-Fix for incineration, the decision was made to send the drums with the water in them to Perma-Fix. Currently there are six drums.

Mr. Martin provided an explanation to Michelle Mandis' (Ecology) inquiry during the April PMM regarding the discrepancy between CWC and T Plant numbers. Mr. Martin stated that he used a summary report from waste services which provides numbers for the total month, whereas Darrin Faulk (FH) was using the SWITS database, which gives a snapshot in time. Mr. Faulk will coordinate with Mr. Martin and use the one-way service report.

III. Project Specific Issues

A. LDR Storage Assessment

Mr. Martin stated that Ecology's comments on the LDR storage assessment are being reviewed. Mr. Martin noted that there has been only one change to the table for cell activity, which occurred in 2002 when an LDC was added to the cell.

IV. General Discussions

- A. Ms. Mandis inquired about an incident at T Plant on April 30 when a drum lid popped. Mike Collins (RL) responded that void filling operations were being conducted on the Albany waste stream, and a drum lid popped off. There was a lid restraint on the drum, so there were no worker safety issues. A couple days later void filling was switched to another tank farms waste stream and another drum lid popped. Mr. Collins noted that the drums met the waste acceptance criteria that have been implemented since 1993. Based on that, no venting of these waste streams was deemed necessary. As a result of the popping lids, the drums from these waste streams will be vented prior to resuming void filling unless additional characterization is performed that indicates void filling can be safely done without venting.
- B. Steve Szendre (Ecology) inquired about drums and boxes that are in the parking lot and in back of the facility. Mr. Collins stated that the drums and boxes will remain in the parking lot for some time, and the plan is to put in covered storage at T Plant. The design is a gazebo with netting around it which will provide protection from the wind but would not require fire protection systems. The majority of the drums in the back (R5 storage area) will be moved, but there are some pieces of equipment on plastic that will remain in place for some time. Brett Barnes (FH) added that the containers against the T Plant canyon wall will likely remain in place due to high radiation issues.
- C. Mr. Collins stated that construction of the new roof for 221-T Canyon should start sometime in June.
