CENTRAL PLATEAU (AMCP) DESIGNATION OF ON-SCENE COORDINATORS
FOR REMOVAL ACTIONS FOR THE 200-UW-1 OPERABLE UNIT CONDUCTED
UNDER CERCLA AT THE HANFORD SITE

TO: Kevin D. Leary, AMCP

In accordance with DOE memorandum 05-AMCP-0428, you are delegated the duties and responsibilities of On-Scene-Coordinator (OSC) for all removal actions that occur within the 200-UW-1 Operable Unit.

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This designation is made pursuant to the requirements of 40 CFR 300.120 which directs that the lead agency (DOE) shall assign an OSC to manage removal actions and coordinate activities with the Remedial Project Manager (RPM) on related remedial actions at National Priority List (NPL) sites. The DOE OSCs will direct response efforts and coordinate all other efforts at the scene of CERCLA discharges or releases on the Hanford Site. Although you have been delegated OSC responsibilities, necessary technical direction to DOE contractors will be through a designated Contract Officer Representative (COR), and any scope changes outside the existing contract will be approved by the Contracting Officer (CO). Your primary responsibilities are as follows:

1. The DOE OSC will coordinate and review the work of other agencies, responsible parties, and contractors to assure compliance with the National Contingency Plan (NCP), Records of Decision (ROD), Hanford Federal Facility Agreement and Consent Order (Tri-Party Agreement), Sampling and Analysis Plans (and referenced documents), Remedial Action Work Plans (and referenced documents), administrative order, and lead agency (DOE)-approved plans applicable to the response. The OSC will recommend action to the COR or CO for decisions by lead agency officials.
2. The DOE OSC will evaluate and coordinate all decision-making processes necessary to ensure compliance with the NCP, including agreements between the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) or other federal agencies and the state.
3. The DOE OSC will coordinate activities with EPA and the State of Washington Department of Ecology, as specified under 40 CFR 300.120 and Hanford Federal Facility Agreement and Consent Order (Tri-Party Agreement).



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4. The DOE OSC will ensure that the Hanford Waste Identification Data System is maintained current and accurately identifies individual waste site status and that an Administrative Record meeting the requirements of CERCLA Section 113(k) is established and maintained for each NPL site as required by CERCLA and the Hanford Tri-Party Agreement.
