Dear Messrs. Izatt, Lerch, and Chikalla:

RE: Part A Withdrawal Petition

Please note that Ecology staff have completed review of your June 22, 1989 submittal requesting the withdrawal of five (5) Part A applications for units located within the Hanford facility. These units are as follows:

- * 2727-WA Sodium Reactor Experiment Sodium Storage Building
- * 1706-KE Waste Treatment System
- * 221-T Containment Systems Test Facility
- * 324 Sodium Removal Pilot Plant
- * 332 Storage Facility.

In response to your request, my staff inspected each of these units and have reviewed associated information. The results of our review are as follows:

- a) Ecology hereby approves the request for withdrawal of the 2727-WA Sodium Reactor Experiment Sodium building and the 332 Storage Facility.

- b) Based on available information, Ecology cannot approve the withdrawal of the remaining three applications. If USDOE chooses to pursue these requests, further information will be required as described below:

I) 324 Sodium Removal Plant

- 1) A complete description of the use of the Solution Conditioning Tank.
- 2) Further description of the use of this facility during the 1980-1983 time period. This should include all documentation necessary to support the petition withdrawal (i.e. log books, etc.).

II) 1706-KE Waste Treatment System

- 1) All analytical results for material stored and/or treated in this system.
- 2) More in-depth documentation on the historical operation of this unit. This should include, but not be limited to any pertinent log book entries or other operational descriptions.
- 3) Current waste stream designation data. This must include actual analysis and not be limited to "process knowledge". This designation must be a complete designation per WAC 173-303-070, including the aquatic bioassay. This designation must also include enough sampling and analysis to ensure waste stream variation is accounted for.

III) 221-T Containment System

- 1) Documentation covering designation based on lead contamination.
- 2) Documentation on the designation of generated wastes (particularly metal wastes tests).
- 3) A more accurate flow diagram to include the waste treatment tank.
- 4) Any analytical results on wastes generated, treated or stored at the unit.

For the 332 Storage unit and the 2727-WA Sodium Reactor Experiment Storage unit, Ecology will initiate the formal decision making process as described in WAC 171-303-840. The mechanism by which the Part A will be withdrawn is by denying the application and terminating interim status. Ecology will prepare a fact sheet and initiate the public comment period. Following the public comment period as described in WAC 173-303-840, Ecology will notify USDOE as to the final disposition of the permit (denial of final status and termination of interim status). This will complete the process for these two units.
