Summary of Discussion and Commitments/Agreements

1. STATUS OF PERMIT APPLICATION

Mr. J. Coenenberg (WHC) stated that the next LERF notice of deficiency (NOD) workshop meeting was scheduled for January 26, 1994. Scheduled for discussion are Chapter 5 (geological resources) of the Part B Permit Application, the unresolved NODs from the previous NOD workshop meeting, and the next group of NODs.

2. PROGRAM STATUS

- Provide LERF Waste Minimization Plan to EPA

Resolution of NOD 116 included providing the LERF waste minimization plan to Mr. D. Duncan (EPA). Mr. Coenenberg reported that the waste minimization plan is currently undergoing integration, and he indicated that the plan should be completed by the end of March 1994. Mr. Duncan inquired about the program elements that are being integrated into the waste minimization plan. Mr. Coenenberg responded that the following plans are being integrated: tank farm maintenance waste minimization plan, a waste minimization and reduction plan, and tank farm waste management plan. An appendix will be attached which will include specific treatment, storage and disposal (TSD) units within the tank farms.

- Provide DOE Order(s) Requiring Waste Minimization Plans to EPA

It was agreed to informally transmit to Mr. Duncan and Mr. M. Jaraysi (Ecology) a copy of DOE order 5400.1, which requires a waste minimization plan.

3. GENERAL DISCUSSION

- Discuss How LDR Will Affect Future Uses of LERF After Storage of 242-A Evaporator Process Condensate in Basins

At the request of Mr. Jaraysi, Mr. Coenenberg initiated a discussion regarding the impact of land disposal restrictions (LDRs) on the future use of LERF after storage of 242-A Evaporator process condensate in the LERF basins and when 200 ETF becomes operational. Mr. Jaraysi stated that it had become apparent,

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through discussions involving the use of LERF basins after completing the initial function of storing liquid effluent until 200 ETF is operational, that LDRs may prohibit the use of LERF basins. Ms. J. Williams (WHC) responded that WHC has an action to match Tri-Party Agreement (TPA) milestones M-26-03 and -04 with the 200 ETF start-up date of June 1995. Ms. Williams stated that those milestones were recently changed, and the dates need to be changed accordingly. Ms. Williams added that WHC is evaluating those milestones, including the impact of LDRs.

Mr. Clark noted the possibility of requesting a variance to allow the storage of LDR waste beyond the allowed time frame.

Mr. A. Stone (Ecology) stated that Ecology is waiting for input from its experts before providing a recommendation regarding LDRs.

- **242-A Evaporator Restart Date**

Mr. B. Von Bargaen (WHC) stated that WHC has completed its operational readiness review and submitted all the prestart punchlist items. DOE-Headquarters has committed to perform an operational readiness evaluation (ORE) at the 242-A Evaporator Facility beginning January 17, 1994. Mr. Von Bargaen estimated that the ORE, the following authorization for restart, and the configuration changes in the plant resulting from the ORE will take approximately five weeks. The scheduled restart date is February 28, 1994.

Mr. Stone announced that Ecology has transferred the 242-A Evaporator permitting from the Lacey, Washington office to the Kennewick, Washington office, and that he will be the new unit manager.

Mr. Jaraysi inquired about the repairs to the third basin. Mr. T. Galioto (WHC) responded that repair of the basin is dependent upon the weather, and if the weather holds, repair could begin the first of March 1994. Mr. Galioto estimated it would be several months before repairs to the basin would be completed.

4. ACTION ITEMS

There were no past or present action items to status.

5. NEXT MEETING DATE

The next Unit Managers Meeting was scheduled for the third week of February 1994.
