Subject: References on trustee coordination with DOE and DOD

Many of us are facing issues of how trustees deal with the Departments of Defense and Energy on natural resource issues at Superfund sites. In the course of reviewing a document for one of our coordinators, I collected several references that I thought might be useful as general background when dealing with these issues. Keep in mind that DOE and DOD call their remedial programs "restoration", which is not the same as natural resource restoration, so you need to remember the terminology difference and clarify what you are referring to when you are dealing with these agencies.
