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Summary of Discussion and Commitments/Agreements

STATUS OF PERMIT APPLICATION

Mr. J. Coenenberg (WHC) stated that WHC is in the process of responding to Ecology's notice of deficiency (NOD) comments.

2. PROGRAM STATUS

Mr. B. Von Bargen (WHC) provided an update on the program status. The water hammer incident at the 200 Area steam plant resulted in a shutdown of six weeks, and completion of some of the packages has been impacted. The process control plan is out for review. The slurry has not been moved from Tank 6 AW to Tank 6 AN. The start-up date is scheduled for September 15, 1994, which is two weeks ahead of the original schedule.

Mr. A. Stone (Ecology) inquired about which tanks will be used for Campaign 2. Mr. Von Bargen stated that tanks 1 AP, 7 AP, and 8 AP will be used for Campaign 2. The tanks contain about three million gallons, and approximately an 87 percent waste volume reduction will be achieved during the second campaign.

3. GENERAL DISCUSSION

Mr. Stone reported that the results of Ecology's compliance inspection indicate that the 242-A Evaporator is in complete compliance.

Mr. Coenenberg inquired about when a new Ecology unit manager would be assigned for LERF, 200 ETF, and the 242-A Evaporator. Mr. Jaraysi responded that the unit manager would not be assigned before October 1994. Mr. Jaraysi noted that he and Mr. Stone would provide support after the new unit manager is assigned in an effort to continue with the progress on the three projects.

Mr. Jaraysi inquired about the change package for the milestones affecting the operation of the LERF basins. Mr. S. Godfrey (WHC) responded that a presentation is scheduled to be given to Ecology this Friday (8-25-94) regarding the evaluation of alternate LERF treatment. Mr. Godfrey added that WHC has prepared a request to the EPA for use of LERF for treatment. The treatment proposed is flow and pH equalization. The request for treatment was submitted

to RL yesterday (8-22-94) for review. A presentation regarding the request for treatment will be given at the next M-17 and Liquid Effluent Consent Order Unit Managers Meeting, scheduled for September 16, 1994. Mr. Godfrey stated that if the EPA approves the request by September 30, 1994, the milestones would be deleted. If the request is not approved, a change request will be submitted to extend those milestones. Mr. Godfrey noted that the EPA will be including Ecology during the decision-making process. Mr. Coenenberg suggested that Mr. D. Duncan (EPA) be notified of the presentation scheduled this Friday. Mr. Godfrey concurred, noting that Mr. D. Sherwood (EPA) had already been notified. Mr. A. Vogt (WHC) inquired about the milestones. Mr. Godfrey stated that the two milestones are M-26-03, which is to cease discharge by 12-31-94; and M-26-04, which is to clean out the basins by 6-30-95.

4. ACTION ITEMS

Action item 5-19-94:1, provide Ecology the waste analysis plan sampling data when available from the first campaign.

Mr. Von Bargen noted that the 1 AP and 7 AP data was provided to Ecology several months ago. The 8 AP packages and the slurry data will be validated and available in mid-October. WHC has received the process condensate data from the offsite laboratory, and it is presently going through internal validation. Mr. Von Bargen estimated that the process condensate data should be available to Ecology before the October 1994 Unit Managers Meeting. This action item was left open.

There was some discussion regarding the procedure for transmitting the sampling data to Ecology. At the present time, the entire data packages are transmitted. Mr. Stone stated his preference for summaries accompanying the data packages, and suggested that RL/WHC send a letter to Ecology requesting a procedure for transmitting the sampling data.

There were no new action items generated during the meeting.

The next Unit Managers Meeting was scheduled for September 28, 1994.
