**REVISED NOTIFICATION OF TOXIC SUBSTANCES CONTROL ACT
(TSCA)/POLYCHLORINATED BIPHENYL (PCB) WASTE ACTIVITY FORM**

The enclosed Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Notification Form 7701-53 is being resubmitted as required by Title 40, Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 761.205(f) to remove "permitted disposer" from the notification form. The revised notification form states that the Hanford Site is a generator with onsite storage facility.

The Hanford Site Low-Level Burial Grounds 218-E-12B Trench 94 was operated as a Chemical Waste Landfill under a compliance agreement between the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE), Richland Operations Office (RL), and the EPA, Region 10, for the disposal of defueled Navy reactor compartments. At the request of EPA, Region 10, "permitted disposer" was added to the notification in 1992. EPA communicated in a letter from Michael A. Bussel, EPA, to James E. Rasmussen, RL, dated November 1, 1999, that it concurred with the interpretation of the TSCA regulations that the Navy reactor compartments being disposed in Trench 94 are PCB Bulk Product waste as defined in Title 40, CFR 761.62(b)(1).

EPA terminated the EPA/DOE compliance agreement and withdrew its interim approval of the Trench 94 Chemical Waste Landfill application. TSCA regulations do not require that PCB Bulk Product waste be disposed in a Chemical Waste Landfill. PCB Bulk Product waste may be disposed in a municipal landfill, or, for waste with a radioactive component, in a landfill authorized to accept radionuclides. Notification using Form EPA 7710-53 does not apply to disposal of PCB Bulk Product waste. Hanford will discontinue preparation and submittal of the PCB Annual Reports which are required for PCB disposers.


