SUBJECT: Natural Resource Trusteeship and Ecological Evaluation Workshop

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The Office of Environmental Guidance, RCRA/CERCLA Division (EH-231) is presenting a workshop on Natural Resource Trusteeship and Ecological Evaluation.¹ This workshop is designed for Department of Energy (DOE) and operating contractor personnel with environmental restoration responsibilities that include any or all of the following: negotiating and/or providing legal analysis for Federal Facility Agreements/Interagency Agreements; line management responsibility for CERCLA response actions and/or RCRA corrective action; personnel who may represent DOE to state and Federal Regulators and/or Indian tribes; and those involved in public participation and/or risk communication. The workshop will provide a basic understanding of the statutory and regulatory basis for Natural Resource Trusteeship and the "dual role" DOE has as a Trustee and lead CERCLA response agency. Specific topics to be addressed include:

- ▶ Policies/regulations on DOE accountability for damages resulting from ecologic injuries
- ▶ Trustee/Co-Trustee responsibilities, and relationship to strategic planning requirements
- ▶ Fundamentals of planning and managing ecological risk assessments to fulfill data requirements and facilitate the Department's Trustee role
