The Tri-Party Agencies recommended Alternative 2 beginning this summer in the 100 Area Nuclear Waste clean up is a favorable decision. It would be helpful to get the Oregon public more aware of the current progress, and up to date on the future envisioned plans, via newspapers and TV advertisements.

As far as the 1995 budget , and the future allocated amounts needed to finish the 300 Area and the 200 Area, the tax payers need a more constant news coverage to encourage our Congressmen and State Representatives to pass further tax dollars to be allocated to achieve this goal on a federal level.

Where does the \$100,000. 00 a day come from to keep the Nuclear Hanford doors open? Allocated War Department funds or Federal Taxes? Why is it so difficult to get the additional money over and above that daily amount to pay the workers that complete the clean up task? The CLEAN UP TASK is the goal.
