

HAZARDOUS WASTE DIVISION FUNCTIONAL STATEMENTS

Hazardous Waste Policy Office

The Hazardous Waste Policy Office has the general responsibility of dealing with problems and issues that cut across the Superfund and RCRA programs, or require special attention not possible within the normal operating programs.

The Office includes the Community Relations Section, which acts as advisors and coordinators for both Superfund and RCRA community relations activities. The rest of the Office are the policy staff. Their responsibilities include such matters as hazardous waste minimization, the Pacific Northwest Hazardous Waste Advisory Council, Superfund capacity assurance planning, and RCRA and Superfund policy issues.

Superfund Branch

The Superfund Branch consists of five sections; Superfund Program Management Section, Superfund Response and Investigations Section, and Superfund Site Management Sections I, II, and III. The Branch is responsible for overall development and implementation of the Superfund program in Region 10, except Federal Facilities. This includes all the activities in the Superfund pipeline from adding sites to the list of potentially uncontrolled hazardous waste sites, through the various pre-remedial activities of preliminary assessment and site inspections, listing on the National Priorities List, conducting the Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study (RI/FS), remedial design, and remedial action and to the final step of deletion. It also includes conducting removal investigations and removal actions, as required. The Branch is responsible for coordinating Superfund activities within Region 10, developing regional policies, and taking enforcement actions as appropriate.

The Branch serves as Superfund Program Manager. This function includes; resource planning, resource allocation recommendations, and prioritization of support activities in ESD, Regional Counsel, and Operations Offices. In conducting the above listed activities, the Branch is responsible for seeing that all the statutory and regulatory requirements of the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act are carried out. The Branch is also responsible for managing contracts and cooperative agreements with states.

In addition, the Superfund Response and Investigations Section is responsible for responding to emergency episodes such as oil spills, hazardous material spills, chemical fires, etc. It also has responsibility for working with the states in implementing the provisions of Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act of 1986 (Title III).

HAZARDOUS WASTE DIVISION FUNCTIONAL STATEMENTS CONTINUED

Waste Management Branch

The Waste Management Branch consists of three sections; RCRA Program Development, RCRA Compliance, and RCRA Permits; and the Solid Waste Program. The Branch is responsible for solid and hazardous waste management, regional hazardous waste policy development, technical and financial assistance through grants to federal, state, and local agencies, and technical assistance to industry.

The Branch is also responsible for issuing RCRA permits, conducting compliance inspections, and taking enforcement actions as appropriate. These functions may be delegated to the states. To ensure effective implementation of solid and hazardous waste program requirements throughout the Region, the Branch devotes considerable attention to helping develop state program capability. State hazardous waste and solid waste program development is accomplished through grant programs, technical assistance, and oversight of state activities.

Federal Facilities Superfund Branch

The Federal Facilities Superfund Branch is responsible for the development and implementation of a program to carry out the Section 120 requirements of the Superfund Amendments. These amendments require federal facilities to assess sites on the hazardous waste pre-remedial docket, and then to carry out the Superfund process on those sites named to the National Priorities List.
