A meeting was held on February 3, 2021 at Central Plateau Cleanup Company (CPCCo) via the Microsoft Team Meeting application and these minutes are a summary of the discussions.

ADMINISTRATIVE

- Next ERDF Interface Meeting – The next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, February 17, 2021
- Attendees/Delegations – Representatives from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the U.S. Department of Energy, Richland Operations Office (RL) were present to conduct the business of the meeting
- Agenda – Attachment 1 is the meeting agenda

TOPICS DISCUSSED

Safety Topic

Operations – Craig Larson

- **Status General Operations**
 - ERDF continues to receive waste containers from PFP trailer village, 100K, and other miscellaneous waste sites
 - ERDF is preparing inactive ERDF roll-on/roll-off containers as sacrificial containers to transport and dispose of PRF rubble. The tailgates are being welded closed to seal the container to minimize hazards during transport and disposal. Use of sacrificial containers eliminates the unloading of waste from the containers and reduces handling by placing the loaded sacrificial containers directly in ERDF and then covering with other waste or soil.
 - DOE indicated the 100K project is nearing completion of overburden removal on three sites and ERDF should expect additional waste volumes in February.
 - DOE thanked ERDF for providing fleet maintenance information. DOE forwarded the information to DOE-HQ.

- **Waste Forecast**
 - ERDF will continue to receive the PFP trailer village waste, 100K, and other miscellaneous waste sites.

Engineering – Bill Borlaug

- **In-Trench Debris Treatment**
 - ERDF is evaluating treatment of waste debris within a standard ERDF roll-on/roll-off sized containers and smaller, such as 324 high dose waste, in the trench to reduce risk to workers.
 - ERDF will provide updates as additional waste characteristics is determined.
 - EPA requested that the Ben Simes, EPA 300 Area Project Representative be included on any in-trench treatment requests regarding the 300 project.

- **Performance Assessment Annual Summary Report**
 - ERDF is preparing the FY2020 annual summary report. No issues during FY2020. ERDF is planning to update the waste forecast during FY2021-FY2022.

- **ERDF Leachate Transfers**
 - The ERDF leachate transfers continue with no issues.

- **ERDF Annual Report, CY2019 (ERDF-00105) – DOE and EPA Review**
 - EPA and DOE previously provided comments and has no additional comments.
 - EPA requested responses to comments and suggested a separate meeting to discuss.
