Summary of Discussion and Commitments/Agreements

1. Approval of Past Project Managers Meeting Minutes

The May 2, 1996 Project Managers Meeting (PMM) minutes were approved. J. Wallace (Ecology) noted that the Tri-Party Agreement (TPA) is undergoing revision, and that the project management process will be incorporated, which will affect future approval signatures. J. Wallace (Ecology) requested that G. Davis (Ecology) be placed as signatory for the 325 HWTU meeting minutes. J. Wallace (Ecology) also requested to be copied on the meeting minutes and notified of the meeting dates. M. Barnard (DOE-RL) will replace B. DeLannoy (DOE-RL) as signatory for the 325 HWTU meeting minutes.

2. 325 HWTU's Part B Permit Application, WORKING DRAFT, Rev. 1

• Document Status

G. Davis (Ecology) reported that her review of Chapters 2, 3 and 4 is almost complete, and she will transmit informal comments on Chapters 2, 3 and 4 to D. Lutter (PNNL) by close of business tomorrow (6-7-96).

• Part B Application Development

-Discuss timing and scheduling of workshop sessions

M. Barnard (DOE-RL) reported several issues that will impact the Part B Permit Application:

- 1) PNNL will not meet the Modification C deadline of the Hanford Facility Dangerous Waste Permit Application. PNNL is currently four months behind schedule;
- 2) WHC may not be available for regulatory support after the start of the fiscal year, October 1, 1996, which is when the new Maintenance and Integration (M&I) contractor will be on site. If WHC is not available after October 1, PNNL's cost would increase and further delays would be created;
- 3) The 325 HWTU program is currently underrun on their budget, and the funding may be diverted to another program

with an overrun budget, unless justification is provided and accepted for the 325 HWTU program.

- Status of June 5, 1996 Workshop

D. Lutter (PNNL) stated that the workshop has been rescheduled for June 13, 1996.

3. Status of 325 HWTUs NOI Part A for Tank Storage

H. Tilden (PNNL) reported that PNNL is in the process of finalizing the Part A Permit Application submittal to Ecology. H. Tilden (PNNL) noted that the addendum to the Notice of Intent (NOI) has been filed, and since there is no strict guidance in the Washington Administrative Code (WAC) regarding time elapsed between submittal of the addendum to the NOI and submittal of the Part A, he inquired about the appropriate timing for submitting the Part A. J. Wallace (Ecology) responded that PNNL should proceed with submittal of the Part A.

4. Status of Silver List Item Resolution

H. Tilden (PNNL) stated that seven completed close-out forms are ready to transmit to Ecology today (6-6-96). Approximately three to five more close-out forms will be ready to transmit to Ecology by the next PMM.

6. General Discussion

B. Day (PNNL) provided a detailed handout (Attachment 5) describing the occurrence of unpermitted dangerous waste storage in the 325 Shielded Analytical Laboratory Tank 1. B. Day (PNNL) stated that H. Tilden (PNNL) contacted S. Moore (Ecology) to request approval to continue with the discharge of the process waters into Tank 1, and verbal approval was given by S. Moore (Ecology). B. Day (PNNL) noted that J. Wallace and G. Davis (Ecology) were not immediately notified, and in the future J. Wallace or G. Davis (Ecology) would be directly notified in the event of an occurrence.

B. Day (PNNL) stated that the waste in the tank was discharged on June 4, 1996, to WHC. Tank 1 will be managed as a 90-day or less accumulation tank, and PNNL will pursue the submittal of a revised Form 3 to add permitted tank storage for Tank 1.

J. Wallace (Ecology) inquired about the tank monitoring, which would indicate any waste in the tank. R. Steele (PNNL) responded that the volume in the tank was always known; however, he did not recognize that the material was dangerous waste. R. Steele (PNNL) explained that the waste consisted of pure process water and/or a leaching solution, which is dilute sodium bicarbonate, which is not a dangerous waste. However, when the material came in contact with the cell environment, it turned into dangerous waste. J. Wallace (Ecology) requested a copy of PNNL's tank operating procedure. J. Wallace also requested that G. Davis (Ecology) investigate the management of nondangerous waste in a dangerous waste tank system to clarify whether or not it would be considered an issue.

R. Steele (PNNL) elaborated on the issue of sending permitted waste to the 340 Facility. Waste from the tank characterization program is currently in permitted cell storage, and R. Steele (PNNL) indicated funding should be forthcoming to transfer the waste to the 340 Facility. The funding is available until September 30, 1996 (end of fiscal year), and R. Steele (PNNL) stated that he would be working to move the waste before the September 30 date. J. Wallace (Ecology) inquired about sending the waste residues back to the generator. R. Steele (PNNL) responded that the residues are sent to the generator through the 340 Facility. A meeting was scheduled with J. Wallace (Ecology), G. Davis (Ecology), R. Steele (PNNL) and M. Barnard (DOE-RL) to discuss the issue of transferring the residues. It was agreed to include this item on the agenda for the next PMM.

B. Day (PNNL) also provided a heads-up concerning a perceived compliance issue with regard to future transfers of dangerous

waste in permitted storage from Tank 1 to the 340 90-day or less accumulation area tanks. Resolution of this issue will be pursued. H. Tilden (PNNL) noted that this issue is on the Silver list and is being pursued through that modality.

M. Barnard (DOE-RL) noted that PNNL is preparing for the budget process, and that a copy of the schedule will be sent to J. Wallace (Ecology) so that she may attend the meetings.

J. Wallace (Ecology) requested that as project manager for the 300 Area, she preferred that certain issues be removed from the PMM process and that a separate procedure be established to address these issues. The issues include: Silver List items (unless they pertain to the specific unit), funding in general for Treatment, Storage and Disposal Facilities (TSDs), budgeting, and unusual occurrences outside the TSDs.

Subject Unpermitted dangerous waste (DW) storage in 325 Shielded Analytical Laboratory (SAL) Tank (TK-1)

Background Tank TK-1 in room 32 of the 325 building receives liquid mixed (dangerous and radioactive) wastes from the 325 SAL Hot cells on the first floor of the building. The SAL is a part of the interim status DW permitted 325 Hazardous Waste Treatment Units (HWTUs) which is permitted for treatment and container storage. Room 32 is included as part of the permitted SAL.

Liquids in the hot cells drain into the tank through a trench that traverses the hot cells and piping that connects the trench and the tank. Accumulated tank liquids are discharge to the 300 Area Radioactive Liquid Waste System.

Installation of the current tank was recently completed in June 1995. The design and installation of the tank meet the DW tank storage requirements of the DW regulations (WAC 173-303-640).

The 325 HWTUs are not permitted for DW tank storage. A required Notice of Intent (NOI), for the submittal of a revised 325 HWTUs Part A Permit Application (Form 3) revision 4, was issued on November 27, 1995. The revised Form 3 includes tank storage for the TK-1 SAL tank. The NOI had completed the required 150 day public comment phase process. However, an addendum to the NOI was issued on May 2, 1995 to increase the storage and treatment volume limits of the 325 HWTUs. The submittal of the revised Form 3 is subject to Ecology approval. This approval is perceived to be based on adequate public review of the NOI addendum.

Occurrence DW was accumulated in the tank TK-1 in excess of 90 days and therefore required a DW (interim or final) tank storage permit. Process waters have been accumulated in the tank since June 1995 and was assumed to be a low-level waste and was being managed accordingly. Inadequate tank operating procedures may have contributed to the accumulation of the waste for greater than 90 days.

The DW consists of process water mixtures and rinse water contaminated with listed (F001-F005) dangerous waste from TWRS characterization activities conducted in the SAL hot cells. A water-sodium bicarbonate mixture from spent fuel leaching research has and is being added to the tank system thus mixing with residual listed dangerous waste. In addition, water used to wash off equipment contaminated with listed dangerous waste was also added to the tank system. (A mixture of a solid waste [water] and a listed DW is designated as a listed DW.)

Verbal approval to continue the discharge of the process waters into the TK-1 tank was received from Steve Moore of the Kennewick Ecology Office on May 22.

The initial notification for occurrence report RL--PNNL-PNNLNUCL-1996-0021 concerning the incident was filed on May 23.

DW in the TK-1 tank was discharged to the 340 building via the 300 Area RLWS on June 4th under the authority of WHC RLWS Approval number 96-064.

Pathforward Tank TK-1 will be operated as a 90 day or less generator accumulation tank, in accordance with WAC 173-303-200(b)(ii), until submittal of the revised Form 3 is accomplished. Tank operating procedures for the use of the TK-1 are being reviewed and revised to prevent further occurrence of this nature.

The submittal of the revised Form 3 to add permitted tank storage for the TK-1 tank will be pursued.

Resolution of perceived compliance issues, concerning the future transfers of DW in permitted storage from tank TK-1 to the 340 90 day or less accumulation area tanks, will be pursued.
